Introduction

The 2026 UK Defence Investment Plan sets out how the Ministry of Defence intends to transform the Armed Forces following the Strategic Defence Review in 2025.

For combat air, the document makes one message clear:

Future airpower will be built around integration rather than individual aircraft.

Investment is being directed towards sixth-generation combat aircraft, autonomous systems, AI-enabled targeting, integrated air and missile defence, and digital integration – creating a more connected, multi-domain Royal Air Force.

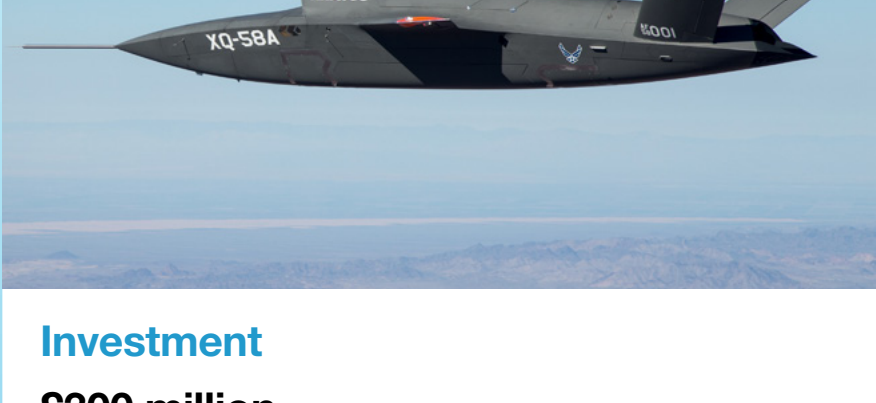


GLOBAL COMBAT AIR PROGRAMME (GCAP)

Investment
£8.6 billion

Key commitments

- Sixth-generation combat aircraft
- Pathway towards Europe's first sixth-generation air force
- Partnership with Italy and Japan
- Strengthens allied interoperability



COLLABORATIVE COMBAT AIRCRAFT (CCA)

Investment
£300 million

Key commitments

- UK autonomous fighter jet programme
- Concept demonstrator flying by at least 2030
- Accelerate operational capability as quickly as possible
- Designed to operate alongside fourth and fifth-generation fighters



TYPHOON

New investment
Over £1.1 billion

Key commitments

- Sustain Typhoon into the 2040s
- Upgrade combat capability
- Support UK aerospace jobs
- Strengthen export opportunities



F-35

Investment
£2.2 billion

Key commitments

- Purchase additional F-35 aircraft
- Purchase the F-35A variant
- Join NATO's Dual Capable Aircraft nuclear mission
- Continue benefiting from substantial UK industrial workshare

Building the Integrated Force DIGITAL TARGETING WEB

Investment
£1.8 billion

The Defence Investment Plan places significant emphasis on creating a Digital Targeting Web capable of connecting:

- Sensors
- AI-enabled decision making
- Aircraft
- Weapons
- Every operational domain

Objective: Reduce the time between target detection and engagement through AI-enabled, software-defined warfare.



ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE

AI underpins:

- GCAP
- Collaborative Combat Aircraft
- Project ASGAR
- Digital Targeting Web

The MOD identifies AI as a foundational technology across the future Integrated Force.



INTEGRATED AIR & MISSILE DEFENCE

Homeland IAMD investment
£790 million

Lessons from Ukraine and the Middle East have reinforced the importance of integrated air and missile defence.

The Defence Investment Plan funds:

- New Integrated Air, Space & Missile Defence Operations Centre
- New command-and-control systems
- New radar and sensing capabilities

Related investments include:

- Expanded counter-drone capability
- Directed Energy Weapons
- Expansion of Sky Sabre

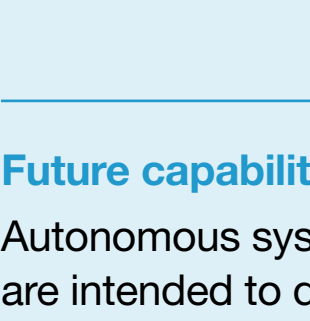
Typhoon, F-35 and future Collaborative Combat Aircraft are all expected to contribute to future UK Integrated Air & Missile Defence.

The Defence Investment Plan allocates over £5 billion across autonomous systems.

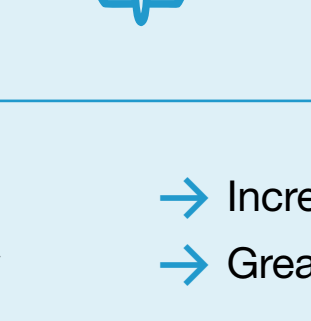
Combat air-related programmes

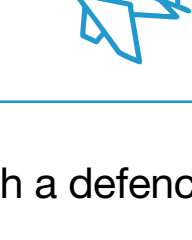
Backing British Aerospace

Future combat air capability will be developed through close cooperation with allies and NATO partners.

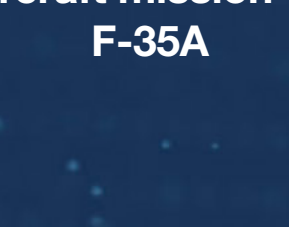

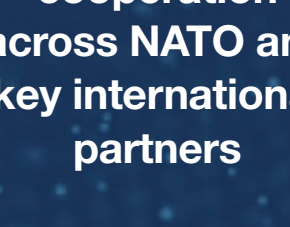
