THE FUTURE OF BRITISH ARMOUR

The Defence Investment Plan outlines a transformation of the British Army into a fifth-generation force designed for NATO warfighting, combining modern armoured vehicles with AI, autonomous systems, long-range fires and digital networks.

Rather than replacing armoured vehicles, the Plan positions them as the protected backbone of a far more connected and lethal land force.

THE ARMOURED VEHICLE INVESTMENT PRIORITIES

BOXER

£2.2 BILLION

8x8 all-terrain armoured vehicle

- Enables rapid deployment and protected manoeuvre
- Built in the West Midlands
- Largest individual armoured vehicle investment within the Land budget



CHALLENGER 3

Next-generation Main Battle Tank

Investment will:

- Complete production of Challenger 3
- Build on the success of Challenger 2 in Ukraine
- Deliver the British Army's future Main Battle Tank capability

Armoured Fighting Vehicle

Continued investment supports the Army's modern reconnaissance capability as part of wider land transformation.

- New versatile 6x6 armoured vehicle system

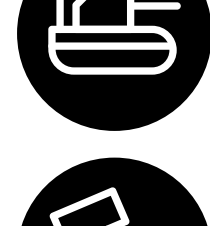

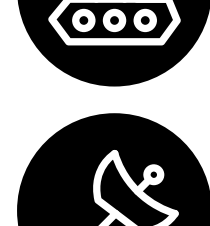

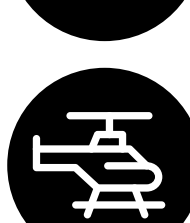
